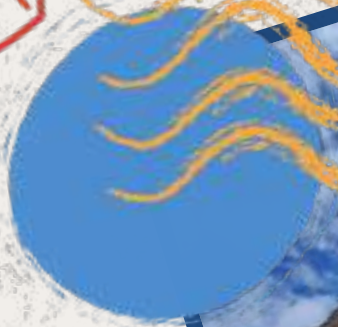

What is Erasmus+?

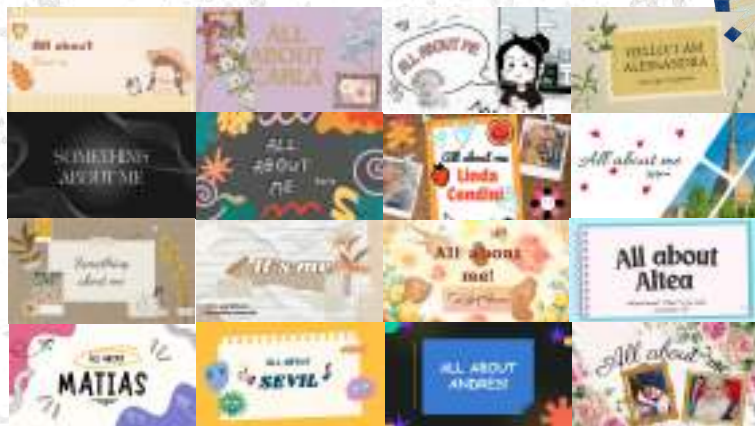
Erasmus Plus is an European Union programme designed to give to students and teachers the chance to experience abroad.

The idea behind is simple but powerful: get out of your own comfort zone, learn about new cultures, improve your skills and grow.

Thanks to this programme, middle school students (and beyond) can take part in trips to other European countries, meet foreign peers, test themselves and stimulate their curiosity and desire to discover the world.

Spanish students in Turin, Italy

7 days to visit Turin



Spanish students arrived in Italy on 28th of March and left for Spain on 5th of April. During their stay, they visited the city of Turin and our school and stayed in a hotel. In some evenings, however, they were hosted at dinner by families, this allowed them to taste typical dishes of the Italian culinary tradition and to live moments of conviviality. To help us get to know each other better, the teachers also organised an outing in the centre of Turin and, at the end of the stay, a pizza dinner all together.

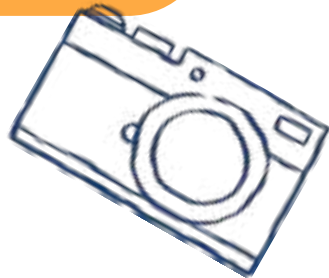
We did many **activities** : we played on the sports field and participated in the podcast of their radio for example.

We travelled by three means of transport: the bus took us to the train, the train brought us to the metro station, and the metro finally got us to the Reina Sofia.

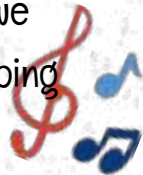
While we were visiting the museum, the audio-guide led us to the most important and famous artworks like "Guernica" (by Picasso).
